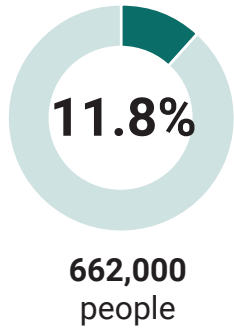


Poverty in Wisconsin

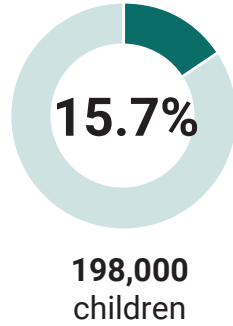
New figures released for 2016

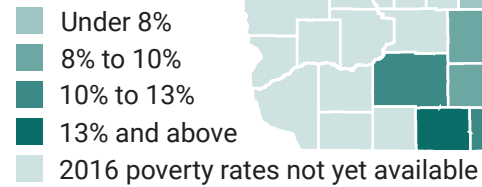
Wisconsin population in poverty



Wisconsin children in poverty

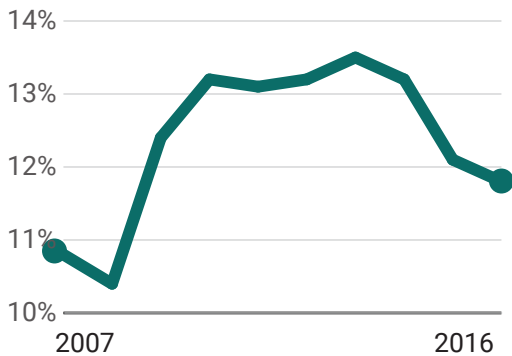

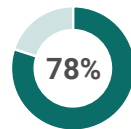


Poverty rates still haven't returned to pre-recession levels in Wisconsin

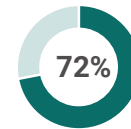
Share of population in poverty in Wisconsin.



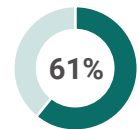
Share of people in poverty in WI in 2016 who...



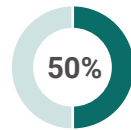
Have at least a high school degree¹



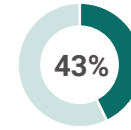
Live outside of Milwaukee County

Worked all or part of the year²



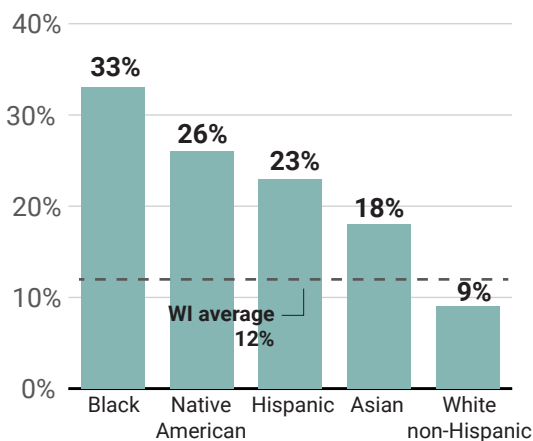
Had income of less than half the poverty level
